


- Information frequently provided by HelpLine:

- Many calls are anonymous
- States HelpLine serves most frequently
 - CA, FL, NY, TX, & NJ
- Top 5 most common liver diseases that callers are affected by:
 - 1. HCV
 - 2. NAFLD/NASH
 - 3. Liver Cancer
 - 4. Alcohol-related Liver Disease
 - 5. HBV







- Informal referrals to other resources
 - 1,400 informal referrals in FY 2013
 - Pharmaceutical's patient assistance programs
 - Copay assistance organizations
 - Local community health centers/FQHCs
 - Local specialists (gastroenterologists, hepatologists & infectious disease specialists)

 - Provide individual patient advocacy or case management
