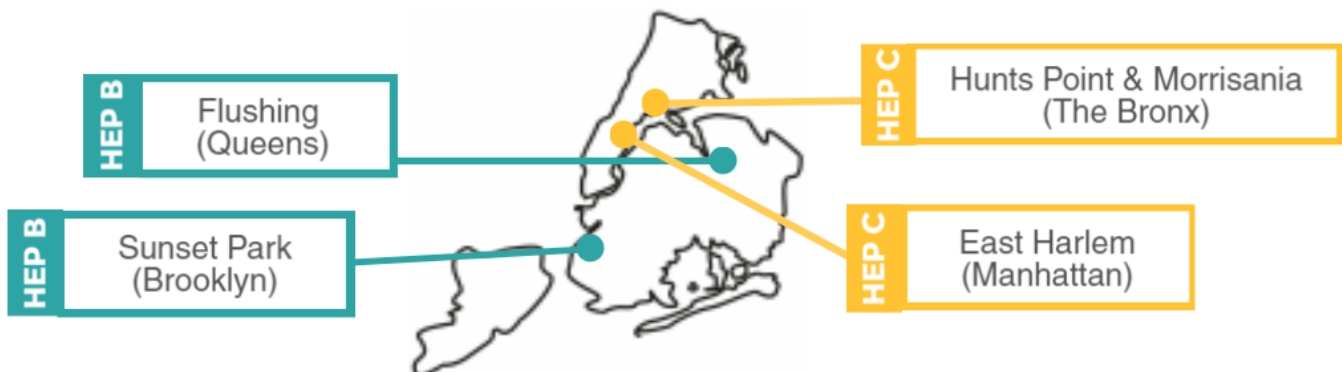


1 in 2 people were born between 1945-1965
