KCS offers free or low cost screenings in New York.

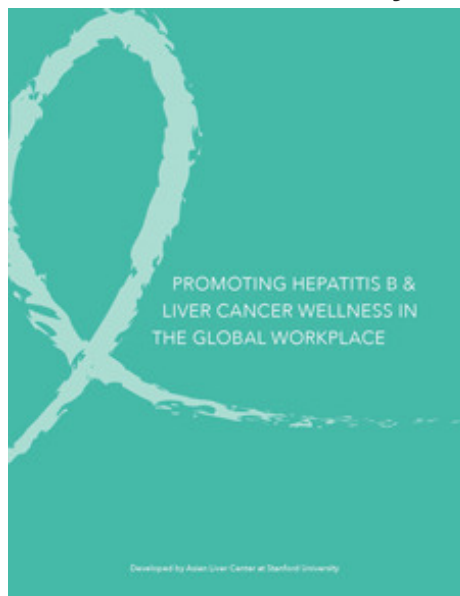
Patients receive free medical assessment and treatment with professional hepatologists or gastroenterologists.

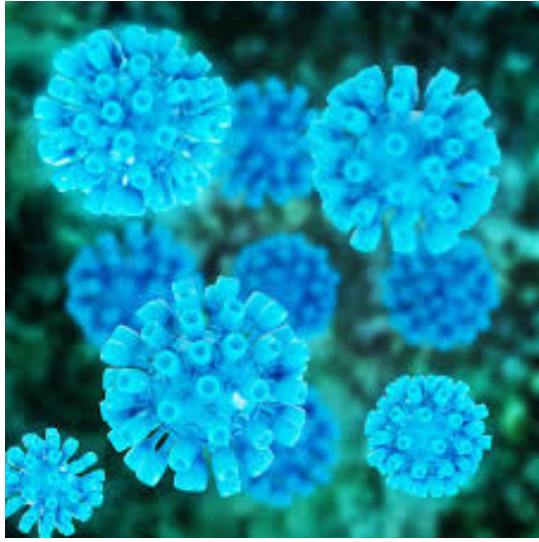

Symptoms

Fever
Fatigue
Headache
Yellow Skin and Eyes
Pale-colored Stool
Abdominal Pain
Dark Urine
Loss of Appetite

Screening Tests

Hepatitis B Blood Test:

HBsAg: Detect presence of hepatitis B virus in your blood.

HBsAb: Checks immunity status

HBcAb: Indicates past or current infection

Vaccination

3-4 shots within a 6 month period.
Highly recommended for children
under 19 years old.



How is Hepatitis B Spread?

- Sexual contact
- Mother to child
- Contact with blood
- Sharing needles

Who should get tested?

- People born in Asia
- People whose parents were born in Asia
- People who live with someone with Hepatitis B
- Women who are pregnant
- Infants born to HBV positive mothers
