

CLINICAL HEPATITIS TRAINING PROGRAM FY2017 FINAL REPORT

Background

- An estimated 146,500 New York City (NYC) residents have hepatitis C (HCV).
- New, simpler treatments now cure HCV in almost all patients. Curing HCV reduces the risk of liver disease and cancer and prevents transmission to others.
- However, only 14% of NYC residents infected with HCV have been cured, even though national guidelines recommend treatment for all HCV-infected persons.
- The number of physicians prepared to treat HCV is too low to meet the demand, since older, more complex HCV treatments were usually administered by medical specialists.

Goal

To increase the number of NYC physicians, and other community health providers, who screen, diagnose, manage and treat HCV according to national guidelines.

Description

The Hepatitis Clinical Training Program created and delivered trainings on best practices in HCV screening, care, treatment and prevention, tailored to the specific needs of NYC providers:


- **1. HCV Grand Rounds**: One-hour overview of HCV best practices for hospitals
- 2. HCV Clinical Provider Training (10 CMEs): Ten-hour online, in-depth curriculum to prepare practicing providers for the New York State (NYS) Medicaid Experienced HCV Provider Classification
- **3. HCV Medication Coverage Training** (2 CMEs): Training on obtaining insurance or patient assistance program coverage for HCV treatment for allied health providers
- **4. HepCure Webinars** (1 CME): Webinars on advanced clinical HCV care topics
- **5. Clinical Mentoring Service:** Consultations for community clinic providers

Impact

In FY2017 (July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017), the program reached:

856 providers at **49** NYC hospitals, clinics, pharmacies or community organizations

Participants of the HCV Clinical Provider Training reported that they felt **very prepared to identify, treat and/or refer HCV patients** after the training, which reached 38 providers.


