





Opioid-related Overdose Deaths in NYS 1999-2015





- HIV & HCV Prevention Education
- Overdose Responder Training w/ Naloxone
- Referrals & Escorts to other care
- Counseling
- Peer Support
- Syringes & safer drug consumption supplies
- Condom Distribution







Drug User Health Hubs


Syringe Exchange Programs that use innovative approaches to engage disconnected PWUD & prevent opioid overdoses among them

Development of Hubs




To develop community specific interventions






Preventing Overdoses

- Basic primary care as needed







HCV Testing at Hubs
