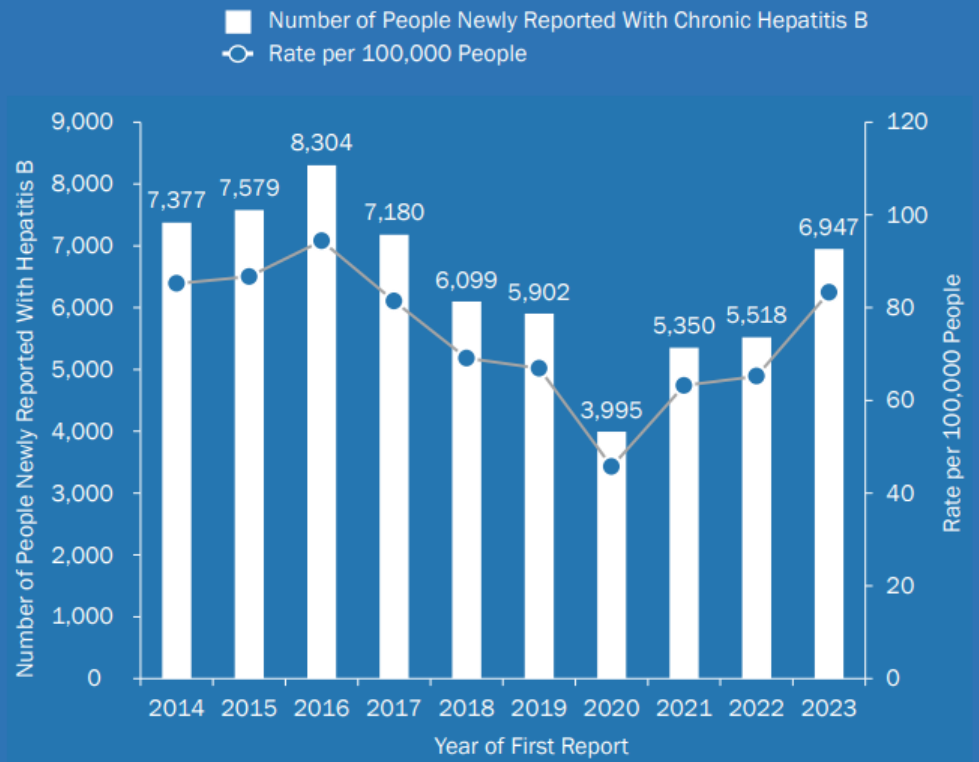

Newly Reported Cases of Chronic Hepatitis B in 2023



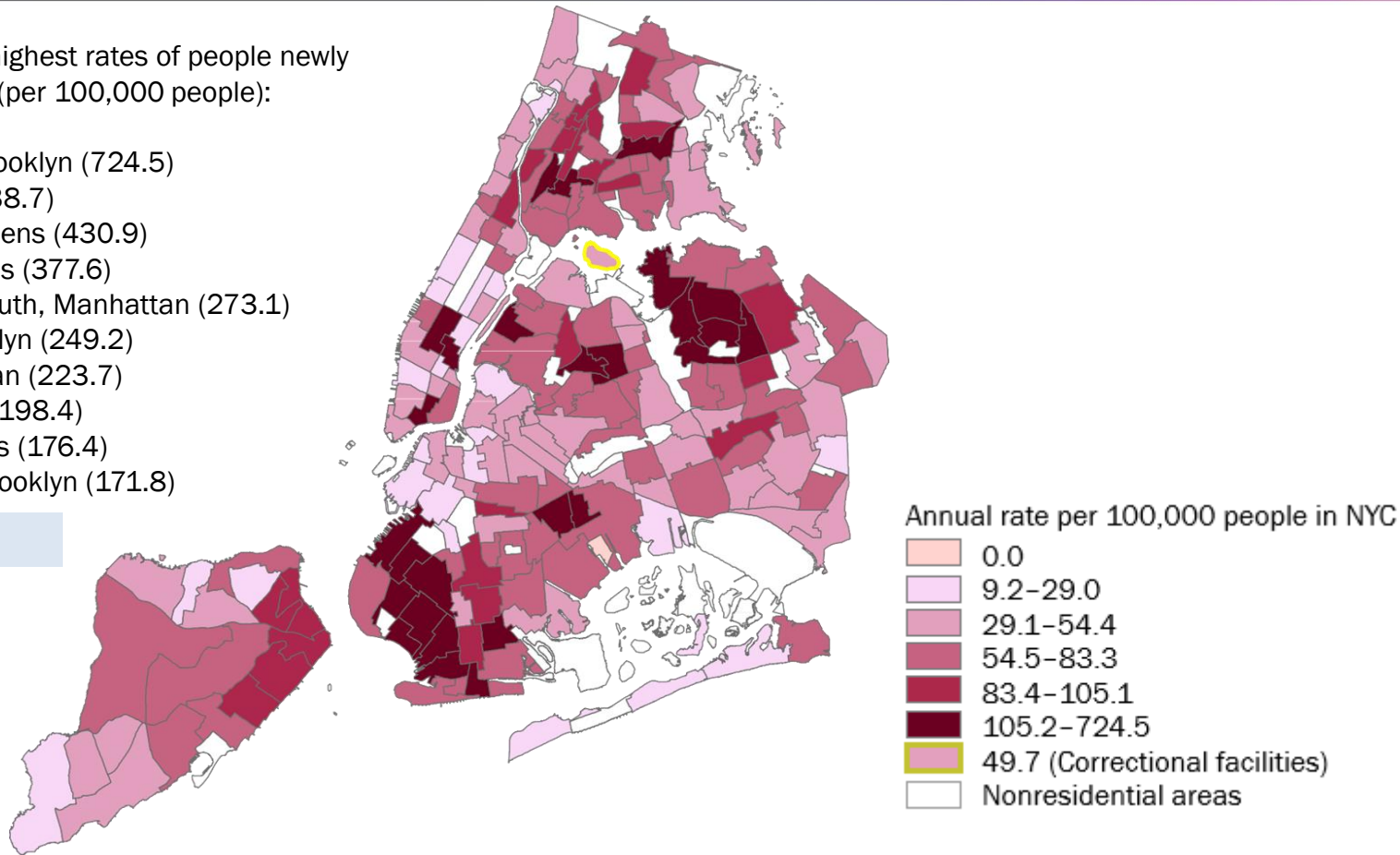

Neighborhoods with the highest rates of people newly reported with hepatitis B (per 100,000 people):

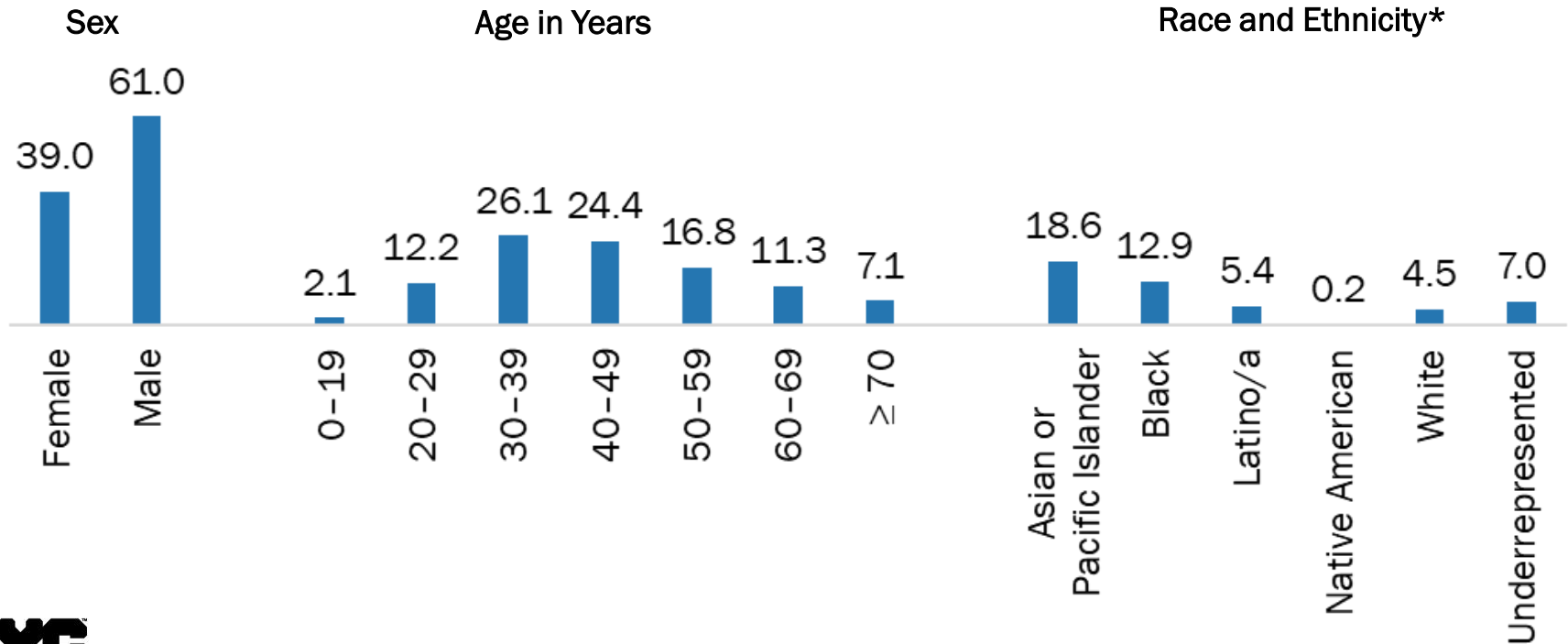
1. Sunset Park East, Brooklyn (724.5)

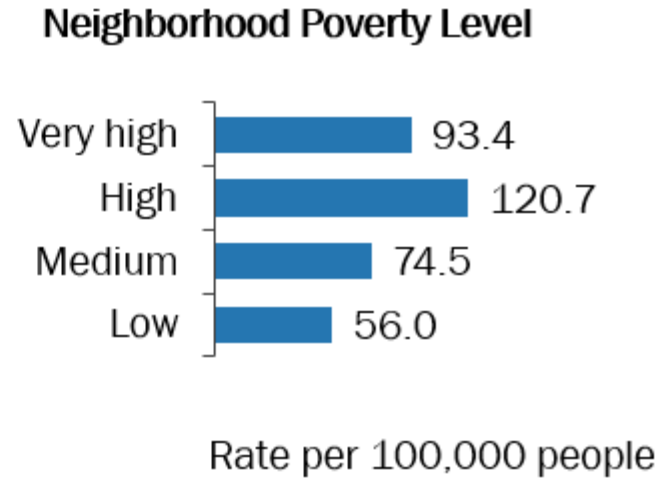
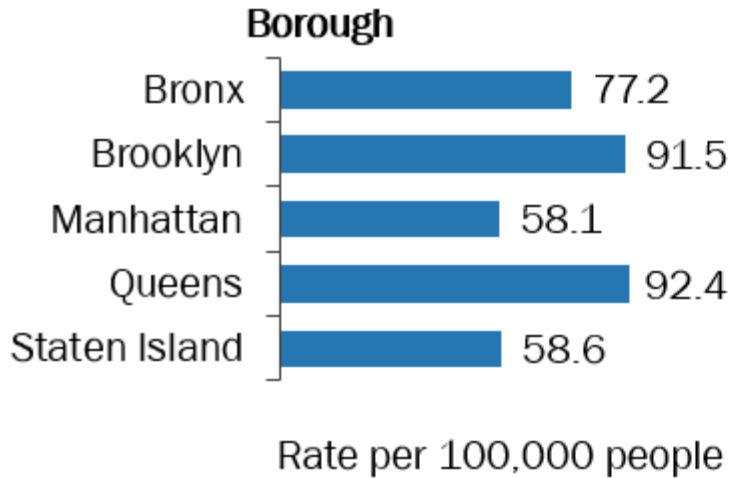

Percentage of people newly reported with chronic hepatitis B in NYC by sex, age, and race and ethnicity, 2023



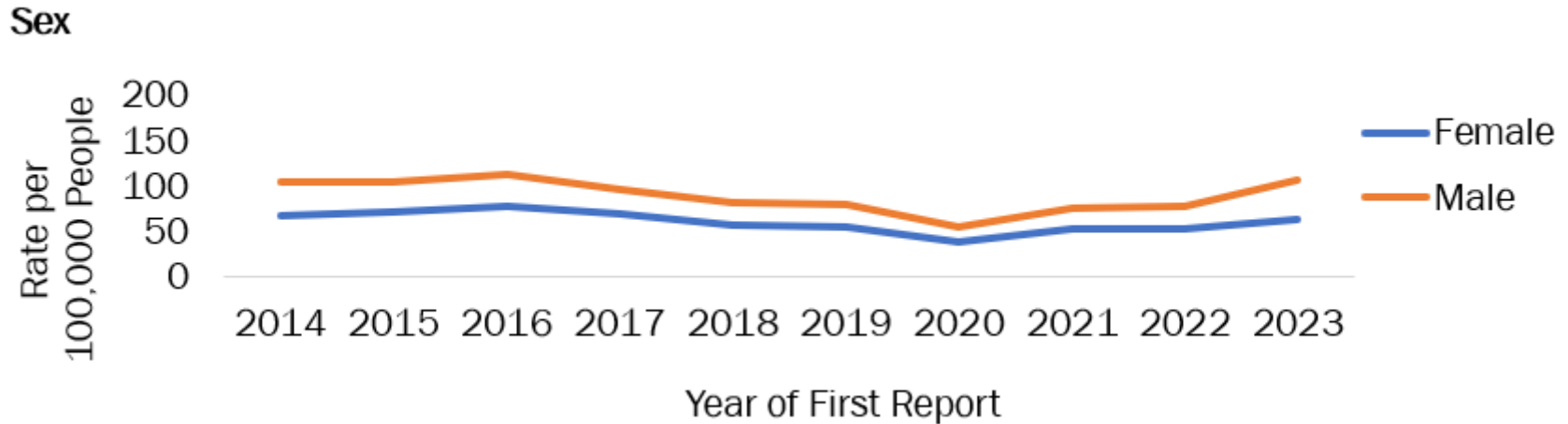

Rate of people newly reported with chronic hepatitis B in NYC by borough and neighborhood poverty level, 2023



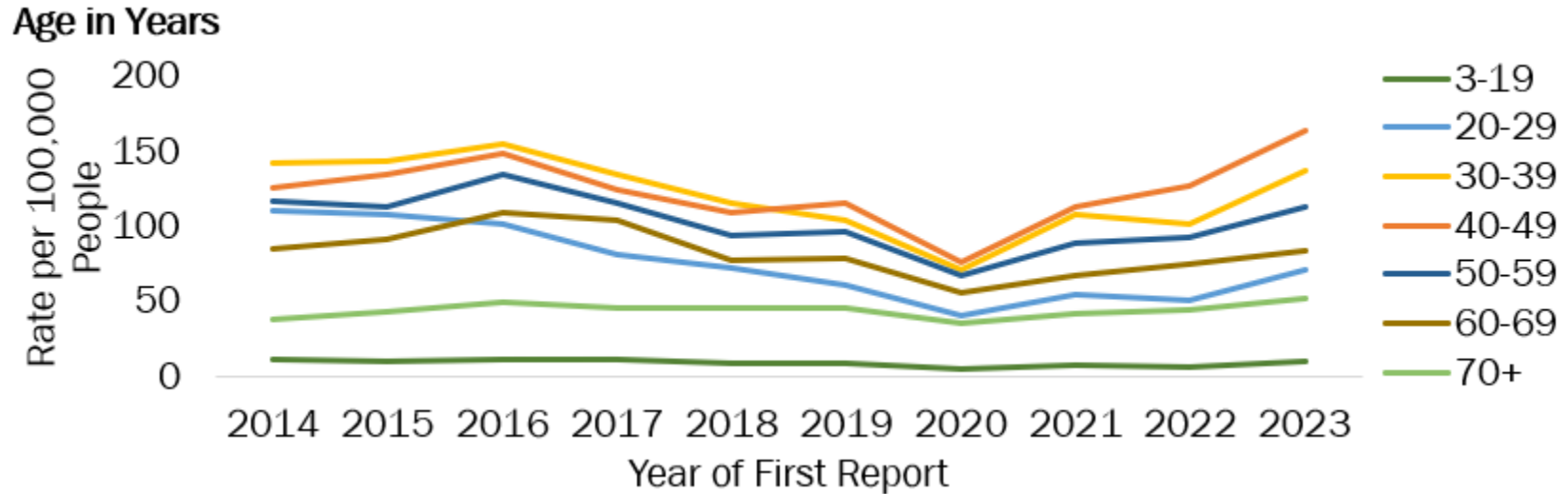

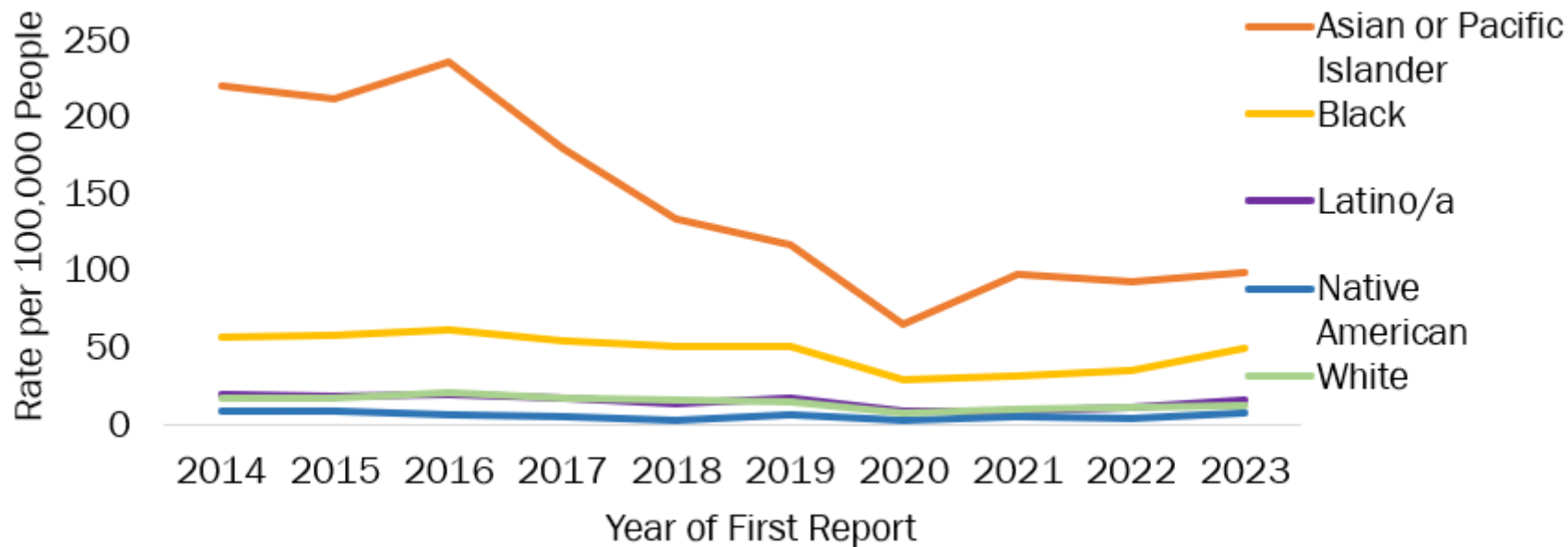
Ten-year trend in rates of people newly reported with chronic hepatitis B in NYC by age, 2014-2023

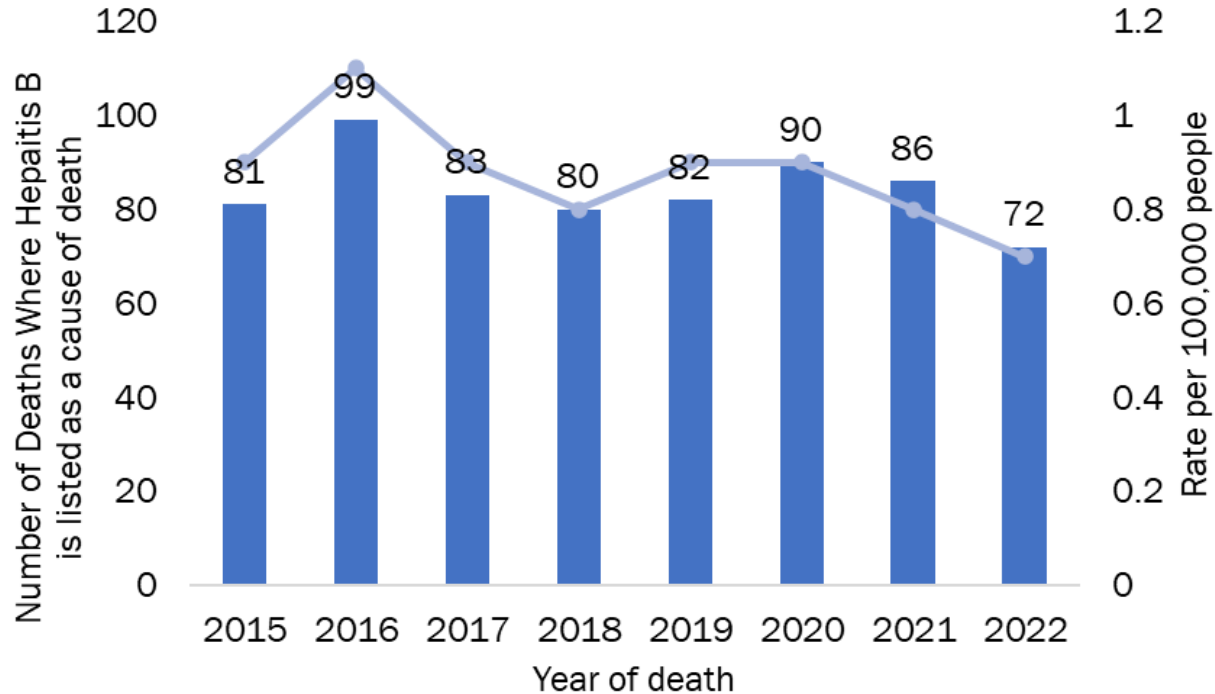
Ten-year trend in rates of people newly reported with chronic hepatitis B in NYC by race and ethnicity*, 2014-2023

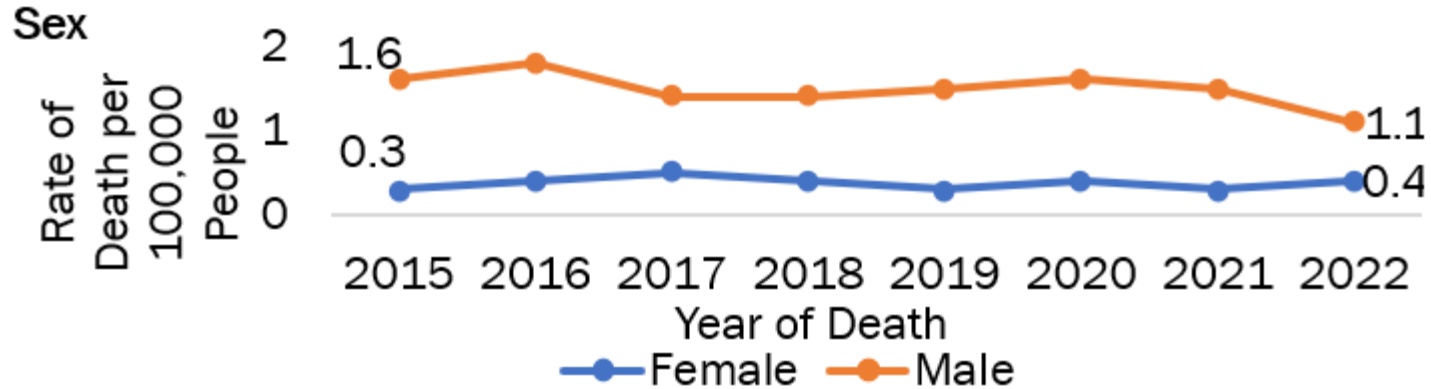
Deaths Where Hepatitis B is Listed as the Underlying Cause

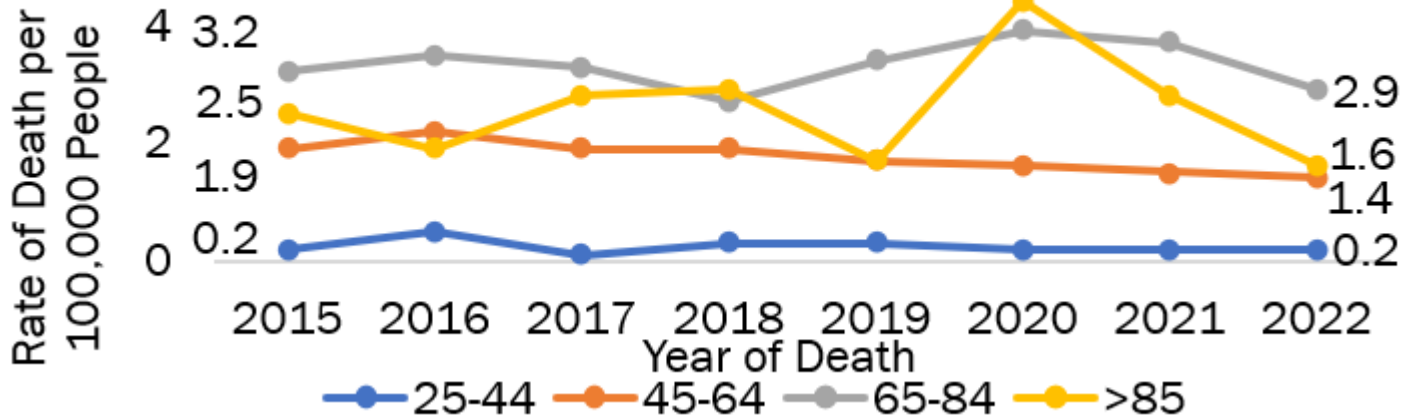
Age-adjusted or age-specific death rate where hepatitis B is listed as a cause of death in NYC by sex, 2015–2022

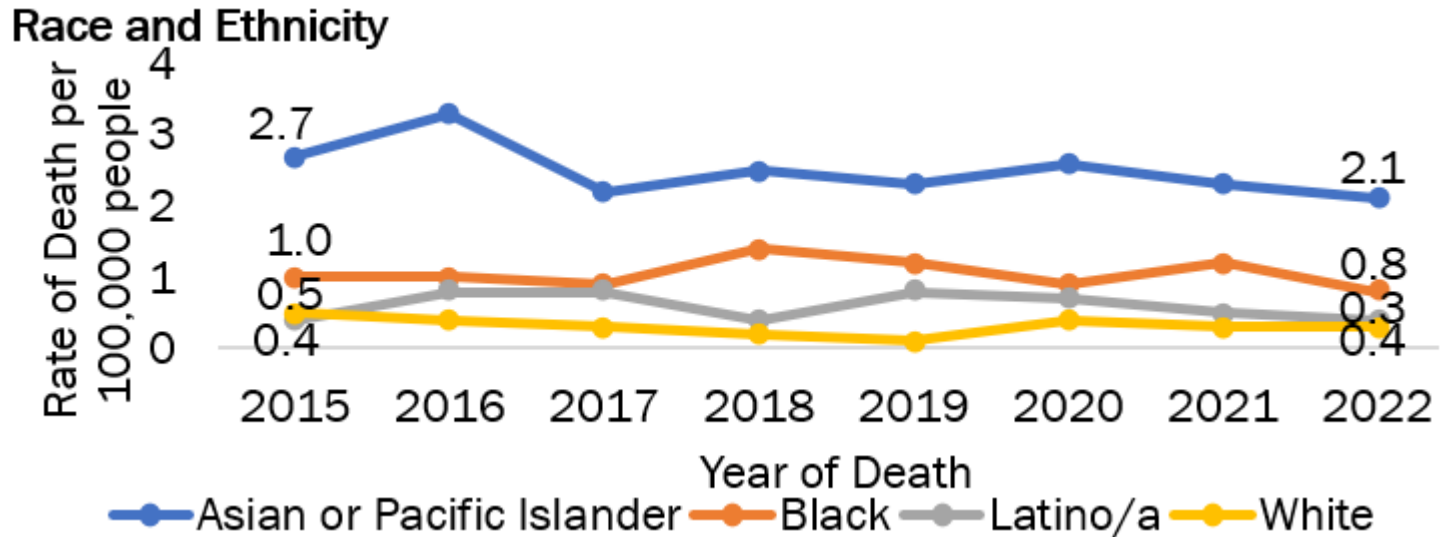
Age-adjusted or age-specific death rate where hepatitis B is listed as a cause of death in NYC by age, 2015–2022
